<a href="#">AB 806</a>	<b>Assemblymember Ash Kalra (D-San Jose)</b>		Allows a credit against those taxes for each taxable year beginning on or after January 1, 2018, in an amount equal to a specified percentage of the amount paid or incurred by a family caregiver during the taxable year for eligible expenses. <a href="#">AB 1500</a>	<b>Assemblymember Brian Maienschein (R-San Diego)</b>		Provides for submission to the voters of the Elders Living with Dignity, Empathy, Respect, and Serenity Bond Act of 2018 and provides that the state would be authorized to issue and sell bonds, the proceeds of which would be placed in a fund to be used for the purpose of renovating, or constructing, or purchasing equipment for, specialized day services centers for dementia, funding startup costs of programs, or program expansion of eligible facilities. <a href="#">SB 177</a>	<b>Senator Janet Nguyen (R-Garden Grove)</b>	<b>Association of CA Caregiver Resource Centers</b>	Appropriates a specified sum from the General Fund to the State Department of Health Care Services for allocation to caregiver resource centers (CRCs) for the purpose of providing respite care services. Authorizes those services to be provided in person and, except for respite care services, through the use of remote technologies.	Support	Senate Health Committee

<a href="#">SB 413</a>	<b>Senator Mike Morrell (R-Rancho Cucamonga)</b>	<b>Conference of CA Bar Association</b>	Makes technical, nonsubstantive changes to provisions that relate to dementia and conservators. Authorizes a conservator to place a conservatee in a secured perimeter residential care facility for the elderly, or to authorize the administration of certain prescribed medications. <a href="#">SB 481</a>	<b>Senator Richard Pan (D-Sacramento)</b>	<b>CA Hospital Association</b>	Amends an existing law which requires the attending physician of a resident in a skilled nursing facility or intermediate care facility that prescribes or orders a medical intervention or that requires the informed consent of a patient who lacks the capacity to provide that consent to inform the facility. Provides that, before implementing a medical intervention that requires informed consent that the physician, skilled nursing facility, or intermediate care facility notify the resident.
